What we do...

We are not a motorcycle club. If you are looking for a motorcycle club, we are not it. "Some" of our members own bikes and ride them to our events, or ride to our events as a group, but we do not require nor emphasize motorcycle riding.

We visit the VA hospital on a regular basis, do fund raising for the Michigan Disabled Veteran's Group. We support local veteran's homeless shelter(s). We support two Veterans Adult Foster Care Homes.

We donate, present and replace, as needed, POW/MIA flags to businesses that support our cause. We support other veteran groups in their endeavors. We also support other Rolling Thunder® Inc. Chapters.

While some Rolling Thunder® members are WWII, Korean, Vietnam, Desert Storm, Iraq Freedom and Afghanistan Veterans, many are not; but every member is dedicated to our mission.

How we got started:

Rolling Thunder® Inc. began on Memorial Day, 1987 when about 2,500 people gathered in Washington D.C. for a visit to the Vietnam Memorial and to peacefully demonstrate their dissatisfaction with the U.S. government's lack of action toward finding and returning thousands of Veterans left behind from past wars after the troops were brought home. The annual event has grown to more than 750,000 people from across the U.S. and many Foreign Countries.

The name "**Rolling Thunder**" came from the sounds of the F-105's and B-52's bombing runs during the Vietnam War.

Rolling Thunder® Inc. is a relatively young organization, formed by 80-chapter members in 1995. Today, there are 97 chapters across the U.S.

Thinking of Joining?

You need not be a veteran to join... Membership is open to all persons, male or female over the age of 18, (40% of all members are not Veterans). You must attend at least three meetings and three events each year to remain a member.

Junior members are also welcome when sponsored by an adult chapter member.

In addition to the annual Memorial Day **Rolling Thunder® Inc.** Run to Washington D.C the Michigan Chapters join in with other Veterans Groups to raise awareness for the POW/MIA issue.
